Our daughter-in-law, Catherine, has connected with this convent and has been helping them with meals and supplies. The suitcase we brought was full to overflowing with clothing for children and mothers, diapers, sanitary products, toothbrushes, and pull-ups. We were also able to donate some euros for the convent to use for some ongoing expenses. Please enjoy these photos of the people who were blessed by your generosity, and hold them in your prayers.

The nun in white is Sister Vergine. (She is Catherine's favorite.) She is so kind and the children follow her everywhere and say "thank you Sister Vergine, I love you!" And she says, "sì sì I love you too child" The gentleman in the white shirt and sunglasses is Antonio, the hairdresser who connected Catherine to this convent.



There are two teenagers in these photos (we aren't allowed to show their faces). The young boy on the right arrived the first time Catherine was there. He and his mother took a bus from the northeastern Italian border. They speak a bit of Italian. Mariupol is their home.



The nun in black has helped to set up Italian lessons for everyone. She is very friendly. Catherine speaks English to her, at her request, to further her English. :)

Catherine reports that "Sweet Sister Vergine and her 'teenagers' as she calls them are free of attitude from what I've seen. Very sweet. The young lady on the left is quite shy so she typically hangs out with the little children when I am there, wrangling in the courtyard or playroom."

Here is an entire trunk full of supplies including what we sent!

Three of bags are from a local Ukrainian Catherine met on Facebook, as well as a box of food. The green bag is a bunch of a baby supplies that Catherine donated, along with a ton of diapers.

Catherine turned the cash we gave into euros and added some money from a few other friends. It was 200€ total! The original plan was to give the children a fun outing to the Naples zoo but the war in Ukraine has not slowed down and they are going to be there for a while. So they decided to give the money to Mother Superior and she can give it to Ukrainians to go grocery shopping. Sister Vergine said they love to walk to the local grocer and buy things themselves. It helps them feel normal.





June 21st for basic training.




Kelsey Eckerd

school to become an attorney.




Brenna Silvio

Hymn Sing On The Spot

HYMN SING ON THE SPOT (COMING TO A SERVICE NEAR YOU ~ SUMMER 2022)

Do you have a favorite hymn? During worship in July and August, the prelude will be **your** opportunity to request any hymn for us to sing together as a congregation. At each service we'll take two or three requests, singing one verse of each hymn. You can offer your suggestion at the beginning of the service ("on the spot") or if you'd like to tell us in advance, you can click and submit the hymn title(s) on this form. You can also write your favorite title(s) on the "Hymn Sing On The Spot" sheet on the bulletin board next to the choir room. As Psalm 95 says, "O come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!"

HIGHLIGHT ON HYMNS ~ COME, JOIN THE DANCE OF TRINITY (ELW 412)



Our hymnal contains tunes and texts of God's people across centuries, cultures and traditions of our faith. When we sing, listen or perform in worship, we are uniting in praise to our enduring Creator and connecting with believers through the ages. Some hymns have evolved from ancient chants, with texts added later. Some artists were gifted with skills to write both lyrics and music for their works. Yet other hymns were poems first and the music followed later, often written by completely different people and sometimes years or even generations apart from one another. Other hymns were recognized as familiar melodies in their day, sacred or secular, and writers composed lyrics to fit the music. And that's the case with the Hymn of the Day we'll be singing on June 12 (Holy Trinity Sunday): Come, Join the Dance of Trinity. Using the tune Kingsford, a traditional English folk

melody, composer Richard Leach wrote this hymn text as an imaginative, multi-sensory celebration of the Trinity. The four stanzas describe clear roles of each member of the Trinity while also pointing out how the three persons intertwine - or "dance" - together. Composed in 2001 (revised 2002) for Trinity Church on the Green, New Haven, CT, "Come, Join the Dance of Trinity" was the winning entry in the Church's 250th anniversary hymn search and was included in our hymnal, Evangelical Lutheran Worship, in 2006. Richard Leach (b. 1953) holds a Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary and was first inspired to write hymn texts when he took a course at Yale Divinity School in 1987. Since then, he has composed more than 200 hymns texts.
