any of us have chosen a Lenten discipline. I hope you are experiencing God's presence through these new disciplines. I have chosen to take on a morning prayer walk. As I walk, I breathe in deeply -- breath in gratitude and breath out stress and discouragement. I often pray for each of you. As I have walked these past weeks, I have paid more attention to the signs of spring blossoming all around. The air has become fragrant. The flowers are showing their colors. The birds are chirping.

Spring is a wonderful sign of resurrection that reminds me of a silent retreat that I took some years ago. I stayed alone in a small cottage in Lancaster County. Each morning of the three days of retreat, I sat outside to read scripture and pray. On the last morning, the lesson was from Matthew 26:26 – 29

"Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by worrying can add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these."

These words came as an invitation to look and listen to the beauty and sounds of God's good creation all around me. Gifts I had been missing because of busyness and fatigue. As I recall that morning, I remember that suddenly I could hear the sweet voices of birds singing. They had obviously been singing all along, but I had been too distracted to hear them. Since that morning, when I hear birds singing, I remember God's gift of that morning.

Springtime holds the promise of rebirth in the signs of flowers that begin to bloom, light green grass emerging from dormancy to new life, and birds singing their songs of joy. May these gifts of the Spring Lenten season also remind us of the coming resurrection day and of Jesus who brings new birth from all that seems lifeless.

Church Music Sunday is April 30.

Join us on Sunday, April 30, when hymns, anthems and music written by women will accompany our morning worship services, including performances by our bell choir, chancel choir, instrumentalists and children.



"...listen to those around you, as they hold the faith for you."

In recent weeks, we have heard the above phrase in our order of worship during Affirmation of Faith, when we confess our faith with words of the Apostles' Creed. Barn Geese Worship, the resource guiding us in questions of Lent, puts it this way:

Today we affirm our faith by answering questions, to truly consider what we believe. If you are unable to affirm each statement, listen to those around you, as they hold the faith for you.

Such power and confidence of the assembly (all of us) to join our voices in unison and profess aloud what we believe. And yet also, space and grace for each of us in moments - even seasons - of questioning, doubt or struggle. To be bolstered. Carried. Included.

Before I learned to play handbells (a few years ago), it was perplexing to me how the ensemble - each ringer with just two notes, one in each hand - would play hymns and anthems like any other musical instrument. Being accustomed to the availability of 88 keys (piano) or 2-1/2 octaves (saxophone), I wondered how this could be possible. With only two bells?

It took just one rehearsal to appreciate what "only two bells" meant: none of us ever has to play *ALL* the notes. We **listen** to everyone around us, to our left and right, up and down the tables with the tones of the scale, each of us ringing our bells in tempo to bring the music to life.

Now that I've been here for over a year, I continue to be amazed and impressed at all the moving parts, dedicated hands and willing hearts that support, sustain and grow your worship, ministries, outreach and community. All of these efforts - divvied up like bells in each of our hands and then performed all together - bring God's love and presence to life here at

Trinity and beyond these walls. And like a musical work or the affirmation of what we believe (or hope to believe), you "hold the faith for us."




Good Friday Prayer Walk & Easter Egg Hunt

Attendance at Trinity's monthly Clothing Closet remains high, and every month, we are reminded that the need for the ministry remains strong as well. This month, we were blessed with a donation of around a dozen pairs of brand new black ankle boots. Melissa Jacoby and I were working the "express check-out" table and got to hear first-hand just how important these boots ended up being to someone.

A woman came to our table with a few items including the boots, and she said how tickled she was to have found them. Her father was sick and not expected to live much longer... in fact, it was a surprise that he had made it through the night. She came to Clothing Closet hoping to find an outfit that would be appropriate for his funeral, and she was thrilled to find these new black boots that she would be able to wear for it. Unfortunately, however, she was unable to find a suitable outfit that she could wear with them, but this was a good start.

She must have made conversation with another of the attendees in the room and shared her story because as we were talking, this other woman, who had checked out earlier, left, and come back, reached around her as we were talking, and handed her a \$50-bill. She told this woman to take the money and go buy herself a new outfit for the funeral. The woman was speechless, and shaking, at this beautiful and unexpected gift. Frankly, it took us all a moment to compose ourselves.

Eventually, as we continued to get her checked out, we asked if she wanted to keep the couple of hangers that she had picked up, and she said no, she doesn't have a place to hang clothes at the shelter where she is staying.

The Clothing Closet and the Blessing Box are incredibly important ministries to our neighbors in ways that we may never even fully know, but honestly, I almost always come away from that day feeling ministered to myself. There is room, and need, for more volunteers each month. We've been blessed recently to draw a few volunteers who are not Trinity members or attendees to come and help. But we would love to have more! Please consider joining us one month. I promise it will be worth your time.


