ometimes God teaches us valuable lessons through the eyes of a child. A few months ago, my daughter in law, Stacy, sent me a photo of little Isaiah at the park. It was one of the first times he went down a slide. Here is the caption Stacy wrote under the photo: "Mommy went too fast down the spiral slide so he was scared of the slide the next time. He was also unsure of the passageways that had holes in them but had great confidence as long as mommy held his hand."

Many of us can identify with Isaiah. Something may have caused us to be afraid and may even stop us from trying that new thing again. But when we remember that our divine parent is holding our hand, we find strength, confidence, and delight beyond measure.

There is an anthem called "Do not be afraid" by Philip Stopford. It is based on Isaiah 43 and was commissioned by Andrew and Kathryn Radley on the occasion of the baptism of their daughter, Sophia Elizabeth, on October 24, 2010. October 8 – What God Does








Worship Notes

New Tidings Feature

Why do they do that?

A new feature of our monthly newsletter is "Why do they do that?" People may often wonder about our liturgy, the symbols in our sanctuary, or other random things about Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. This feature will attempt to answer some of your pressing questions. You may wonder why we have a red candle lit on the wall, or what the large candle next to the font is all about, or even what are those shields hung on the walls in the sanctuary. What questions do you have? Watch for a new question box at the church and give us your best questions, and then watch for the answers. We will start with an easy one, maybe!

Why do we have a red light on the wall next to the altar? The simple answer is that this light is a symbol to remind us that God is always present with us when we gather for worship. Early biblical connections are in the instructions God gave for a lampstand to be made for the construction of the tabernacle (Exodus 27:20-21).



In Roman Catholic tradition, beginning in the 12th century, a light burned in front of the reserved sacrament of consecrated bread and wine that was housed in a box called a "tabernacle." Some Episcopal and Lutheran churches picked up this custom. Later, when Protestant churches built their worship spaces, some included the lamp without the "tabernacle" or box on the wall.



While there are various practices that have evolved over the years, it is a good thing to know what a symbol means for a congregation. At Trinity, the red light serves to remind us that God is always present with us, and especially as we gather in God's name for worship.
