Renewal

everal years ago, before the "great pause" AKA Covid, Church Council read and discussed the book "Anatomy of a Revived Church," by Thom S. Rainer. One of the most important things Rainer stressed was the critical role of prayer in churches who were being renewed.

In response, we committed ourselves to prayer. Groups of us began to gather to pray at the front after each worship service. We began the "Trinity Prayer Pause." People committed to "take a pause" each day at noon to pray for our church. Many signed up for a daily text message as a reminder to pray.

As we continued to pray, the work of the Spirit was becoming more visible among us. The size of our email prayer team grew. Each church meeting began with prayer. And often now, more of you have become comfortable praying out loud with others. We are noticing the signs of Spirit renewal all around us.

This past year, we watched two of our confirmands grow spiritually and affirm their faith on May 19. In June, four families bought their little ones to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, and on August 4, an additional young woman was baptized. If that is not enough joy for you, six people became members that same day. This past week, a woman who stopped in to see the art show said to me, "What is going on at Trinity? Is there something in the water?"

This summer, I met for lunch and conversation with a group of parents to talk about how we can support them in their desire to raise their children in the Christian faith. Initially, these families decided to begin meeting in homes for pot-luck suppers to get to know one another better. They also committed to being in worship together with their children on the first Sunday of each month. Before the sermon, the children will move to our new "family room" area for Bible stories, singing, and a craft.

You may be noticing other signs of renewal. Our pool of volunteers that continues to grow for Christian education, worship assistants, and outreach ministries. One woman mentioned the amazing generosity of folks in donating food for New Hope and the Blessing Box, clothing for the Clothing Closet, and those loaded and overflowing tables of donations of school supplies and green beans for New Hope.

Signs of Spirit renewal are all around us. Watch for them and tell someone about it!

Thank you for praying! God is faithful and the work of the Spirit is amazing.






MEN'S BREAKFAST


