Music Notes

"In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace." ~ Luke 1:78-79

Waiting

One of the hymns we'll sing in Advent goes: "... Sun of justice, shine upon us; we are trusting in your promise. We are waiting for Jesus; Jesus brings peace." (ACS 905, v. 1) Waiting always sounds so much easier on paper or in a song than in actual practice, whether what we're waiting for is as big-picture as justice and peace or as small-scale as moments in line, in traffic, in meetings, or on hold, all while navigating everyday life.

Recently, our family experienced waiting when "Puppy-Who-Needed-a-Home-and-Came-to-Live-at-Our-House" returned from the vet adorned in a plastic cone...that needed to remain securely around his neck for 10 to 14 days! Eventually, he upgraded to an inflatable donut ring (pictured) and managed through the required time frame. And yes, we humans survived in caring for him, too.

Waiting can be arduous, even when the anticipated outcome is known: a date on the calendar or a generational promise by God to reconcile God's people and creation. Pastor, author and hymn writer Herbert Brokering, in his book **Dog Psalms**, offers an encouraging, poignant, whimsical take on waiting, first from the view of "dog" and then an accompanying human version. Here are excerpts from his essay: "/ Wait."


I AM DOG. I am patient.

I can be taught to wait. I do not prefer to wait in a long line; I want to be the only dog waiting... When I know you love me, I live for you with every breath...I wait for you sometimes while singing, sometimes while whimpering, howling, wanting with my whole heart. I will wait without end, knowing I am wanted. I am dog, willing, patient. Waiting prepares me for your presence.

GOD.

You have given me the gift of waiting...I wait for seasons; they go. I wait for another; it comes. I wait for days to dawn, nights to darken, seeds to break open, fruit to fall. As I wait, I learn the gift of patience and the joy of surprise. While I wait, I find myself in your presence. I wait for you; and in waiting, I see you are here, waiting.

Class will not be held on December 22 or 29.




FIRST SUNDAY KIDS


Preserving Trinity's History

On October 14, 2024, lifelong Trinity member and church historian, Cindy Alleman, Mike and I headed to Gettysburg Seminary to archive original historic documents relating to the foundation of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. Two boxes of documents and ledgers dated from 1851 to 1931 have been scanned and preserved in the Seminary's Library Archives.

It was a cold and blustery day, but that did not deter us from visiting the Seminary's Museum to explore four levels of Civil War history which culminated with a recap by an excellent tour guide about the battle fought on June 30th to July 1st, 1863 before climbing up to the cupola to view General John Buford's vantage point of the battlefield that he monitored on those days.

To warm up, we had lunch at Garryowen Irish Pub for Shepherd's Pie, Fish and Chips, and beverages. After all, it was truly a cold and blustery day!
