Many of us watched them grow in the faith as they studied scripture, the small catechism, served among us, assisted in worship, and explored what it means to be an active member of Trinity Church. They have been like trees being planted by water sending out their thirsty roots by the stream. This past Pentecost Sunday, I was honored to confirm Kolton in the faith, to baptize his father, and we all received Jill and Kevin as members at Trinity.

I often think back on Kolton's statement many months ago – "I want to grow deeper in my faith." It seems simple enough. Those who want the same already have the key: weekly worship, study of the Word, prayer, and service to others. Thanks be to God for this amazing gift.


Summer Sounds: Hymn Sing On-the-Spot

From June 5 through June 7, 2025, Pastor Karen, Koen Thomas, Tim Zielonis, and I represented Trinity at this year's Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly. It was held at St. Matthew Lutheran Church in York, which meant some early morning departure times for us, but that did allow for good conversation in the car going to and from!

This was a special year, as we were electing a new bishop. Bishop James Dunlop has served for 12 years and has decided to retire, so we had the opportunity to read some excellent bios and consider some very gifted and skilled people for the position. The energy in the room was palpable as people thought about the future and discerned how we can best move forward in a very challenging time in our country and in the world. The three recipients of the most votes, through each of five ballots, were, in our opinion, very well qualified and would have each done a great job in their own way.

Ultimately, the assembly elected Rev. Stephen Herr, currently serving as pastor of Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church in Gettysburg, as bishop for the next six years. We are excited to welcome him into this role and to work with him in the years to come!

Although there are challenges that we as individual people of faith, as individual churches, and as the Lutheran church as a whole are facing in the current social climate, there was definitely a sense of optimism and opportunity regarding the work that we currently do and that we will do moving forward. It's incredibly energizing to be in a room full of people (and I'm talking around 500 people!) who are bubbling with enthusiasm and energy for doing God's work in the world!

This is a special time in our synod and in the life of the Lutheran church... let us embrace the many opportunities that we have to make a difference in the world!

Harrisburg Area Confirmation Camp at Nawakwa 2025

Around 200 of us students (grades 6 through 12) PLUS older teen and college age counselors, camp staff and clergy from congregations in the Lower Susquehanna Synod gathered for a week of fellowship, learning, worship, prayer, recreation, activities, and listening and looking for God.

There were some rainy weather challenges at the start of our week that affected our itinerary

a bit, especially campfire time in the evenings. But we worked around it. And we didn't let a little rain dampen our spirits! *ATALL*. For example, one of the very stunning traditions is the first evening's worship when everyone lights candles around the baptismal candle with a reminder that we are all children of God.

There is worship with Holy Communion every day at camp. We sing hymns and

praise songs, read scripture and listen to sermons and reflections, commune together and pray. There are key camp-wide topics each day: freedom from sin; community in Christ; the power of water; reconciliation; and sainthood. We also divvy up into smaller groups by age. Two years ago, I was in the Saints track, with emphasis on the sacrament of baptism and what it means to be a saint. This year, Kolton and I were in the God's Gifted People track where we learned about our spiritual gifts and how to use them AND how to recognize spiritual gifts in others.

Pastor Kevin Stout and Pastor Cindy Brommer were the main leaders for our track along with a few laypeople and our counselors. Besides discerning our gifts, we did stations of the cross (the Lutheran camp version), a challenging ropes course (30 feet up off the ground!), and helping refurbish and maintain the prayer labyrinth (2025 marks its 25th year at Camp Nawakwa).



There was free time and fun each day, too. We played GaGa ball (like dodgeball), ultimate frisbee, there was pool time and swimming, photography and crafts, socializing and just hanging out.

Thank you to Pastor Karen for making a special visit to see Kolton and

me on Thursday. And thanks, too, for Kolton going to camp - it made this year the best one I've been to yet!

ORDINATION, BISHOP ELECTION, AND AMMPARO

The first half of 2025 has flown by! And it has been a busy few months here in Colombia, so I want to share some of the highlights with you all. First, on a personal note, I began the year with my final approval interview. In the ordination process (or the process of becoming a pastor) of the ELCA, the final step is a comprehensive evaluation/interview, during which they determine whether to approve you for ordination or not. And... I was approved! Next comes the part of "first call" or my first official job as a pastor, and hopefully, I will have more updates on this in the coming months.

Regarding my work in Colombia... I am still accompanying the congregation, Solo Por Fe, and the True Vine Project (see photos below). I support them with weekly devotionals, pastoral care, visits, and worship on Sundays. I am also supporting the IELCO (Evangelical Lutheran Church in Colombia) with the construction of a Gender Justice Policy.

Next update... The IELCO had its General Assembly in March. The General Assembly is held every 5 years, and there are elections for Bishop, Bishop Vice-president, and the National Administrative Committee. Pastor John Rojas was elected as Bishop, and Pastor Consuelo Preciado was elected as Bishop Vice-President (she is the 2nd female elected as Bishop Vice-President in the IELCO). The assembly was accompanied by the ELCA, the Lutheran World Federation, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, the Finnish Evangelical Lutheran Mission, and the Church of Sweden.

Finally, the executive committee of AMMPARO of the ELCA visited Colombia at the beginning of the year. In short, AMMPARO is the ELCA's Migrant Ministry; it's the ELCA's strategy to Accompany Migrants with Protection, Advocacy, Representation, and Opportunities. With all the things happening in regards to immigration in the United States, the repercussions are felt worldwide, and I was grateful for the accompaniment of this team at the beginning of the year. Being able to learn from them and to share with them was a beautiful exchange, and it was a testament to how powerful we can be if we all work together as one body of Christ.

MAIN STORY

I want to take a moment to introduce myself. My name is Kaitlynne Larson, and I am accompanying the Iglesia Evangelica Luterana de Colombia (IELCO).

A little background about me - I was born and raised in Omaha, Nebraska, with my two older brothers. My mother, two brothers, and three nephews all still live in Omaha. I was raised as an ELCA Lutheran. I even served as the president of the Lutheran Youth Organization of Nebraska in high school. I always found comfort in the church as it provided me with a safe and supportive community. I believe the church is one of the most beautiful spaces for people from all different walks of life to grow together.

I went to Nebraska Wesleyan University, where I studied Global Studies and Spanish. I studied abroad in Cordoba, Argentina, and Montevideo, Uruguay. After graduation, I spent a few years working in local congregations in Nebraska doing children, youth, and family ministry. I transitioned to community organizing in 2016, where I worked doing immigration rights, workers' rights, get-out-the-vote campaigns, and leadership development. After many conversations and many cups of coffee with the people I was organizing with, I realized that certain beliefs and theologies were keeping them powerless. It became clear that I was being called to pursue the path of ordination. I graduated with a Master of Divinity in 2021 from Iliff School of Theology in Denver, Colorado. I am in the process of ordination with the Nebraska Synod. The IELCO and ELCA are supporting my call process, and I was able to do my internship at a local congregation here in Bogota.

In my free time, I love running; I am one of those half-marathon people. I also really enjoy reading, especially poetry, and learning new things or exploring new places.
