Dear Sisters and Brothers.

Thank you so much for the warm welcome as we began ministry together on Sunday, October 12. I am looking forward to our work together as we listen for the direction of the Holy Spirit in living into your mission statement of sharing God's love for all through worship, education and service as well as beginning the holy work of preparing for the process of calling a settled permanent pastor. Our time together will involve listening to the Holy Spirit as well as listening to one another.

It's important to take a step back and use this time of transition mindfully and intentionally. Every 5 years or so, healthy congregations take time to reflect on what is going well and what might no longer be serving the mission effectively. We will work together to fill out Trinity's site profile which will be an important tool to focus our reflections. The profile describes the gifts of the congregation and what gifts are needed by potential candidates to move the congregation into the future. The council will appoint a call committee comprised of lay leaders of various ages and lengths of time with the congregation to help lead the conversation.

This will take time! Please be patient. A spiritual director once cautioned me to avoid moving faster than the Holy Spirit.

Meanwhile, ministry continues at Trinity. It's important to maintain and grow both our personal and congregational spiritual practices. There are many different practices that help us talk and listen to God, not as a mindless rote activity, but as experiences that deepen a relationship with the One Who Loves Us. Reading inspiring literature, attending Sunday School and Bible classes are also vital.

Life is hard and some of us are personally in desperate need of comfort. God comforts through that small still voice we sense during prayer as well as the encouragement and care we provide one another. The grief in the congregation also needs to be named and processed as many grieve Pastor Karen's retirement.

Trinity takes the mission of service seriously. There are many varied ways in which the congregation opens its heart and pocketbooks to provide for our needy neighbors. It's one of the ways we live out Jesus' command to "love one another as I have loved you."

I am looking forward to our time together and getting to know each of you better. Let's hold each other in prayer as we move forward under the wings of the Spirit.

On the piano in our music room at home, there's a stack of hymnals: the 2020 purple supplement "All Creation Sings"; a cranberry-colored ELW that my mother gave me for Christmas "way back" (gasp!) in 2005 when Evangelical Lutheran Worship was brand new; the red SBH with liturgy familiar to my childhood; the green LBW of college and young adulthood, along with the WOV, and "the old brown hymnal" as my grandparents fondly called it (copyright 1935: The Service Hymnal "compiled for general use in all religious services of the church, school, and home").

From this vast, assorted collection, one particular phrase recently swirled to the top in my soundtrack of memories. On repeat!

It was Pastor Barb's first Sunday here. And she passed around to us heart-shaped sunglasses of various colors, inviting us to put them on as an illustration of "seeing" through the lens of God's love: how we read scripture; how we serve and care for our neighbors; how we prepare to embark together in this phase of Trinity's journey; and even how we view ourselves.

And that's when I "heard" it:

Sunday, November 23, 6:30pm.



On Sundays 10/19, 11/2, 11/9, and 11/16, we will be watching and discussing the chapters of Adam Hamilton's DVD entitled *Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity.* "*Enough* is an invitation to rediscover the Bible's wisdom on prudent financial practices. Find the keys to experiencing contentment, overcoming fear, and discovering joy through simplicity and generosity." Although released in 2008, these lessons continue to be relevant and worthwhile even today.

We will *not* have Snax n Study on Sunday, 10/26, as this is Reformation Sunday, and set up for the potluck lunch will take place in Fellowship Hall that morning.

Upon completion of *Enough*, we have several options to consider:

Through Luke's stories we find Jesus' care and compassion for all as he welcomes sinners and outcasts." 


Event Highlights . . .
