Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As I write this letter, we are right in the middle of the season of Epiphany. Epiphany means “to reveal.” We are spending the Sundays before Lent exploring who this Jesus is that was revealed to the nations by the astrologers and in turn who we are as Jesus’ followers.

Lent arrives February 18 with Ash Wednesday. Ashes are an important physical sign on Ash Wednesday. Ancient Jews used ashes as both a sign of grief and repentance. We grieve our sin - moving away from God. We repent – desiring to change direction, change our minds, and live more aligned with the flow of God’s love. We mark our foreheads in the shape of the cross as we look forward to the cross as a sign of God’s reconciliation with all creation.

Ashes also connect us with our own mortality. We’re reminded that we are creatures and rely on God. The words we use to form the cross come from the first book of the Hebrew Bible, Genesis. *By the sweat of your face, you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return.* Genesis 3: 19

Lent is the season we set aside for reflection. We’ve spent Epiphany in light, learning about Jesus and our call to follow Him. Now, the light dims as we reflect on what distracts us from God, what gets in the way of who we are meant to be as beloved children of God.

Daily intentional spiritual practice puts space in our lives for the Holy Spirit to come and dwell and transform. Some of the traditional are Bible reading, fasting, generous giving of money, time or talents, prayer and meditation, spiritual friendship, and accountability. There are countless other ways God calls us to a deeper, richer relationship. The important thing is to be intentional and take the time seriously.

How is God inviting you to relationship this Lent? May your hearts ignite in love of Jesus and in turn allow that love to flow out to each other and our neighborhood. Let us pray for one another as we embark on our Lenten journey together.

Music Notes

Have you ever been focused on a task when - abruptly - song lyrics pop into your head? Maybe lines from a Broadway show or a refrain from current music or even a verse from a hymn?

That's exactly what happened as I read a short, inspiring book titled "*A Year of Less*."

Blogger and freelance author Caitlin Flanders documented her self-imposed year-long shopping ban, a challenge she tackled in 2018 while *simultaneously* reducing and donating more than 50% of the items she owned. Her dramatic transformation - gradually, over months of unwavering determination - is a success story marked by honest self-assessment and consistent, committed action. About stuff. And diminishing its potential to wreak emotional, financial, and organizational havoc on life.

Though this book was not intended as "religious," I viewed some of the key takeaways in the context of faith. For example, Ms. Flanders described how her sense of gratitude for what she (still) has increased exponentially with each new level she reached in giving (more) things away. And by scrutinizing the contents of her home and her shopping habits, she identified things she had "... *purchased with every intention of using, but only because I told myself it would somehow help. I wasn't good enough, but this stuff would make me better. I wanted to read, wear, and do everything so I could become the person I thought I should be.*"

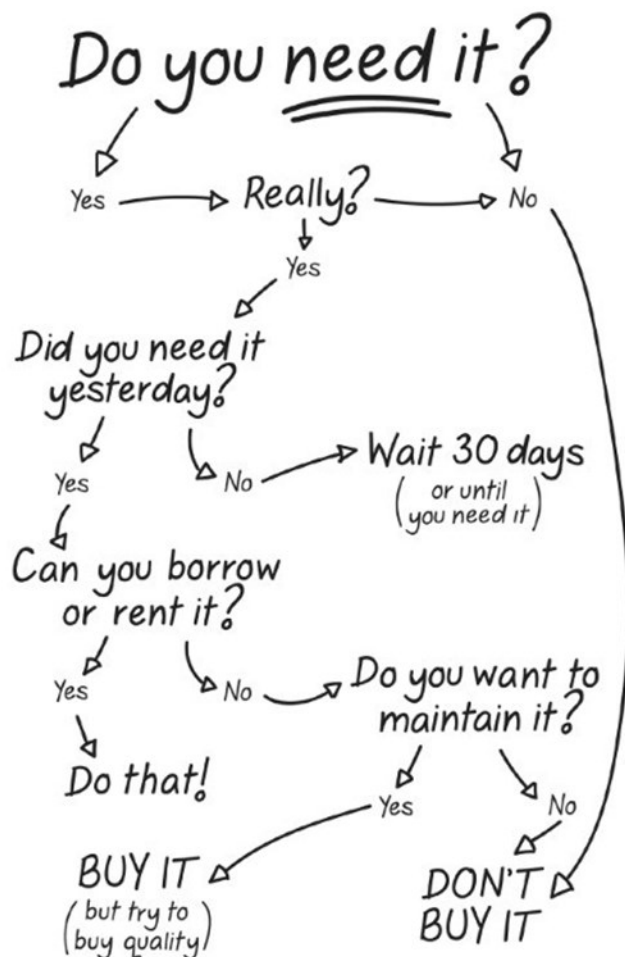
And that's when the music kicked in:

Snax n Study 2026

Beginning on Sunday, January 18, our Snax n Study group will return to one of its favorite topics... we'll be watching episodes of The Chosen. We will spend the first four weeks revisiting the final two episodes of season four, and then we will begin season five, which will ultimately include the Last Supper.

"The Chosen is a groundbreaking historical drama based on the life of Jesus Christ, seen through the eyes of those who knew him. Set against the backdrop of Roman oppression in first-century Israel, the seven-season show shares an authentic and intimate look at Jesus' revolutionary life and teachings." You are welcome to come at any time... you don't have to have seen previous episodes to appreciate the current ones.



Each of our weekly sessions will include time watching the episode and a discussion led by a rotation of volunteer facilitators. "Snax" and fellowship are available beginning at around 8:45 am, and the program will begin at 9:00 am or shortly thereafter (we always wait for the 8:00 am worship service to conclude before beginning our program).

Worship - Ash Wednesday & Lent

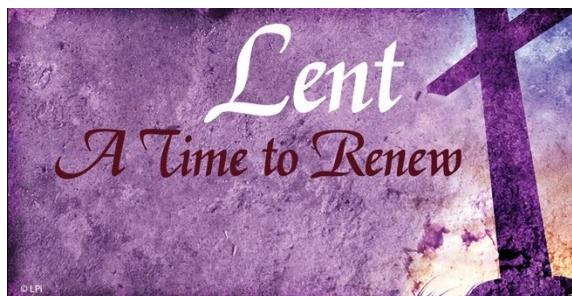


Ash Wednesday service is on February 18: Join us at 7PM in the sanctuary. The service will include the imposition of ashes and Holy Communion. Ashes to Go will be from 7-8 am and 12-1 pm. Ash Wednesday begins Lent. The ashes are made from the palms we wave on Palm Sunday from the previous year. Wearing the ashes reminds us of our mortality and focuses our hearts on our need for repentance.

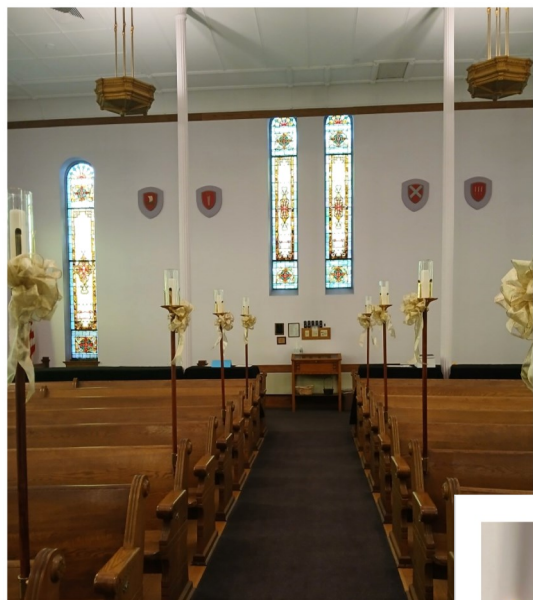

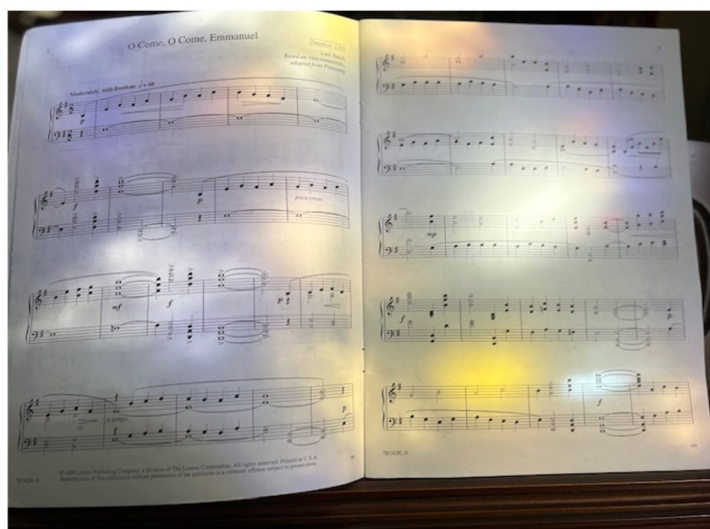

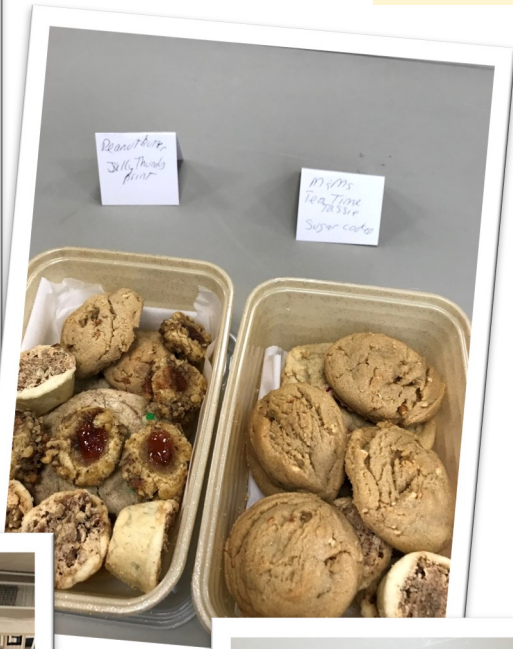

In 2025, the closet welcomed 333 visitors and distributed a total of 2,786 items. December was especially memorable, as attendees received holiday food bags – a thoughtful surprise that brought joy to all. Sincere thanks go out to everyone whose efforts made this special day possible.

Building Community Connections

Over time, we have developed close relationships with many neighbors who attend the closet and face challenges that we may not. Among our friends are Joseph and Keith, who live across the street from the church, Bob, who now travels from Perry County by bus when he can, Loula, Maxine, Micheline, Sally, Rose, Charlene, to name a few. These individuals know us, and we know them. Our church has become a haven – a place where people can consistently receive and share the love of God. On those Saturday mornings, once a month for two hours, there is a unique, heartwarming atmosphere.
