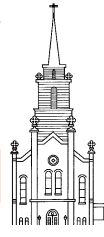

Dear Family,

Summer brings warmer weather. For some of us that means trips to the beach, traveling, camping and theme parks. Others in our family spend time by the pool or putting in the yard. The flowers and trees are blooming, adding color and making us smile even on cloudy, rainy days. Spring and summer are green times. Many of us have gardens for flowers and vegetables. Then, there's the relentless mowing of the lawn.

It's green time in the church too. After Pentecost (the day we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit), the church year slows down, and the liturgical color becomes green until Advent. It's green time, (time after Pentecost) at Trinity.

Green is for growing. In church, we'll talk about growing our relationships with God, growing in our surrender to living in and by the Spirit. Our focus becomes what does life look like anchored in and transformed by God's love?

Pentecost Sunday, we recommitted ourselves to living with God at the center of our lives. We named the gifts the Holy Spirit bestows on each of us: wisdom, understanding, counsel, might, knowledge, fear of the Lord and joy in God's presence. We already have what we need to live as followers of Jesus.

When our hearts open to God's love, the gifts of the Spirit grow like seeds and bring about changes in our behavior and attitudes. Those behaviors are the results or fruit of living in the Spirit. The fruit of Spirit living changes us personally and then changes how we live together as a family of faith. They will know we are disciples by our love.

It's tempting during the summer to make worship less of a priority. I strongly encourage you to remember that our relationship with God is always important no matter the season. God loves you and is worthy of your honor, praise, and adoration.

If you're away, please consider worshipping with another congregation and bring back your bulletin. The Worship and Music team is always interested in new creative ideas for encountering Christ in worship.

Remember to hold our faith family in prayer as we continue to grow and transform through God's love.

## Music Notes

*"Be still and know that I am God."*

~ Psalm 46:10

We've heard Pastor Barb speak often in sermons about the spiritual discipline of sacred presence. As a congregation, we practice this together at the start of each worship service: setting our feet flat on the floor; closing our eyes; taking a deep breath, and sitting quietly in the presence of "*the One who loves us more than words can describe*." It's a brief yet profound moment of silence and stillness. We pause from our busyness, distractions, and personal worries to focus on God's presence and power.

I have to admit, though - I could use a little (*lot!*) more sacred presence practice the rest of the week. So it was quite a coincidence (or maybe a "*God incident*") when I recently stumbled upon a column:

*Can turning off your phone really bring you closer to God?"*

Oh, the irony that, indeed, I was scrolling this article on my phone. But besides that, the points were compelling, self-assessing, and encouraging. A quick synopsis:

- Hurry is the thief of spiritual life (hurry defined here as a gnawing sense that there is always more to do; "*a schedule that leaves little time for God*")
- Jesus' practices of taking a Sabbath, fasting, and spending regular time in silence and solitude are as applicable and attainable now in the twenty-first century as they were in Galilee in 30 C.E.

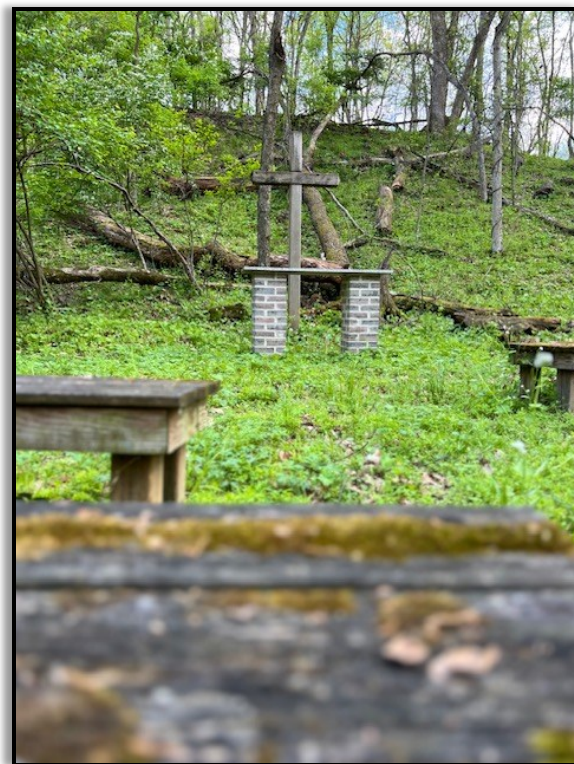
In the foreword to John Mark Comer's book, *The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry* (2019), John Ortberg, writes: "*All my worst moments...are when I'm in a hurry. Love, joy, and peace...are incompatible with hurry. The average iPhone user touches his or her phone 2,617 times a day. (By way of contrast, the psalmist said, "I have set the LORD always before me" [Psalm 16v8, ESV]. What would my life be like if God touched my mind as frequently as I touch my phone?) Take a deep breath. Put your cell phone away. Let your heart slow down. Let God take care of the world.*"

And the hymn concurs:

*Be still, my soul; your God will undertake  
To guide the future - as He has the past.  
Your hope, your confidence let nothing shake;  
All now mysterious shall be bright at last.*

## Sunday Worship at Union Church

Did you know? Union Church - our neighbor just down and across Main Street next to the fire station - is marking its 200th year by inviting congregations that first started here (and Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church is one of them) to worship in this sacred space during their anniversary year. Built in 1825 and consecrated for worship on July 22, 1826, Union Church was the first home for at least seven local congregations who gathered here as the town grew in population and diversity of faith traditions, worshiping and organizing to eventually build churches of their own. Join us for Sunday worship (8:00 & 10:15 a.m.) on September 13 at the historic Union Church. MASD Archivist William Murray, who is also one of the proprietors of Union Church, will be our guest and we'll observe the 16th Sunday after Pentecost just as our nineteenth-century forebears did. What a blessing to commemorate the strong religious heritage of our ancestors in this community!

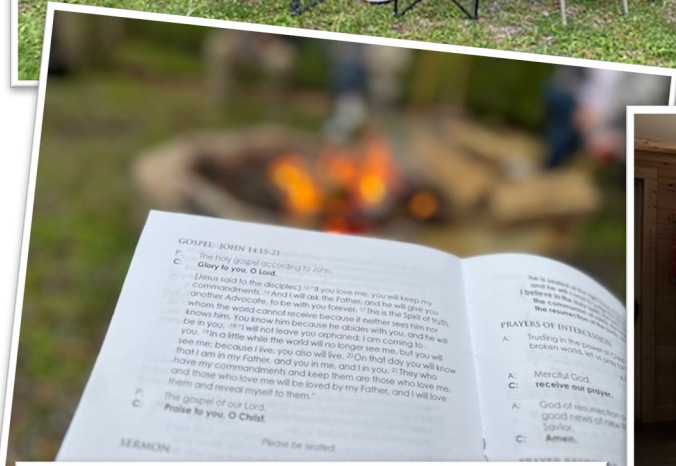

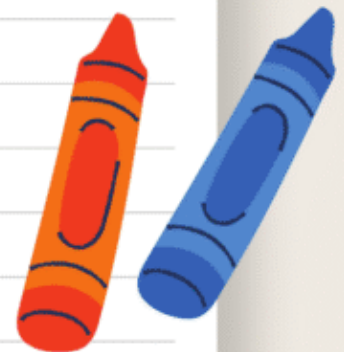
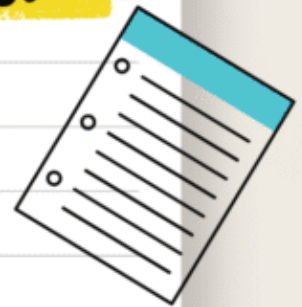
